3. HAZARDOUS IDENTIFICATIONS:

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW: Hazardous Chemical. Clear amber liquid. May cause eye irritation. LD₅₀ for skin absorption in rabbits is >5000 mg/kg. Oral LD₅₀ for rats is >5000 mg/kg.

POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS: This section includes possible adverse effects which could occur if this material is not handled in the recommended manner.

EYE: May cause slight eye irritation. Corneal injury is unlikely.

SKIN: Essentially non-irritating to skin. A single prolonged exposure is not likely to result in the material being absorbed through the skin in harmful amounts. LD₅₀ for skin absorption in rabbits is >5000 mg/kg. Did not cause allergic skin reactions when tested in guinea pigs.

INGESTION: Single dose oral toxicity is extremely low. No hazards anticipated from swallowing small amounts incidental to normal handling operations. The oral LD₅₀ for rats is >5000 mg/kg.

INHALATION: A single brief (minutes) inhalation exposure is not likely to cause adverse effects. The aerosol LC₅₀ for rats is >5 mg/L for 4 hours.

SYSTEMIC (OTHER TARGET ORGAN) EFFECTS: No relevant information found.

CANCER INFORMATION: Did not cause cancer in laboratory animals.

4. FIRST AID:

EYE: Flush eyes with plenty of water.
